

1864 Longstreet Austin Tex. June 6th 1864

Mr W. F. Weeks } Dear William
Houston Texas } since I last wrote to you

I have had some little time to spare and have been looking over the accounts of W. F. Weeks & Co. and have you herewith a statement and balance sheet, I have been and am still anxious that every thing that has passed through my hands should be made plain to prevent any difficulties here after, since the statement sent you I have looked over the account of sales of lots in Weeks' Extension of New Mexico and find that all the sales were carried to the credit of Mrs M. C. Moore - May 23rd 1862. I made up a statement & found that the amount of the principal on the price of lots received to that date was \$9031.²⁵/₁₀₀ 1/12 is \$752.⁶⁰/₁₀₀ W. F. Weeks part which I have carried to the credit of W. F. Weeks & Co. debit of Mrs M. C. Moore that note to April 2nd 1863. The amt principal received was \$3806.²⁵/₁₀₀ 1/12 is \$317.¹⁸/₁₀₀ which I have carried to the credit of W. F. Weeks & Co. debit of Mrs M. C. Moore. I have not included any interest ~~and~~ because I considered the Taxes & Expenses paid by Mrs M. C. Moore would absorb or over balance the interest - and it would now be impossible to make out a correct account of Taxes & Expenses paid and I feel certain that the difference would be small in amount than the sum of M. C. Moore -

My health has been pretty good lately
than yesterday I had to take medicine

I propose to visit Shrewsbury as soon
as I can to settle with the officers for the
hire of slaves working on the Public
Works, some of the officers I found very
intelligent and energetic. others
were indolent and negligent in their duty
& paid no attention to private claims -

I lost two valuable men at Shrewsbury
one died in the hospital, and the surgeon
paid no little attention to the case that he
neglected to enter his name when the probability
of death was great & had great trouble in getting
a certificate of his death, and but for the
persistence & attention of a Capt. Beville of
the Engineer Corps I never could have
been able to get one -

I have been disappointed in not
receiving any letters from you since your
return to Texas - I got a letter from Miss
this morning in which she states that
Mr W has gone to Texas to be with her
and that her daughter Dora who was
badly lame is recovering very slowly.

Remember me kindly to Mr. W. &
all friends & remain best wishes for
yourself & your family
