Dear Mother

Manfield. My dear Sir  
I have two papers of the  
20th with one by mail & the other by Mr Boster  
both read, & in reply will state that I called  
to see Mr Bishop, but that he was not in  
St Lucia, & that I left a written notice that  
by your instructions I was ready to deliver  
the message I will go to St Martinsville  
this evening & will see him as I pass by.  
I will attend while in St Martinsville, to giving  
the order to put Ma in possession of the property  
alluded to in the petition enclosed. I had  
business was not there when I was last in  
town, but I hear has returned, & so so by  
Ma is greatly distressed at the sad news of the  
death of poor Grandpa & is very anxious to  
get Ally away.

Charles & Mabel is expected here, I think his  
visit will do much good to Ma.

Dear Sir,  
I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 13th inst. 1863

and in reply to inform you that I have  
been writing the above I have  
been to the place, of course E. G. Webb  
who arrives likely on Wednesday next  
or quite soon.

I forgot to mention to you that we  
have getting on very well with our  
holding together. We have over 1000 men  
on the way, & will continue to fall  
until the spring make some occasion  
to them.

I have written you further & perhaps in  
relation to the medals & they say they  
will take measures to get some &  
renew it.

There is no movement in any matter,  
and all quiet, and such little news  
is felt as to any advance of the enemy.  
All well here.
